Admissions to JC/MI

• From 2028 JC1 cohort, JC admission criteria will be revised from L1R5 to L1R4;

 This allows students to recalibrate curriculum load by offering one fewer subject, and use freed-up time to pursue their interest and strengthen development of 21st Century Competencies e.g. through CCA or school programmes

1) Qualifying threshold for JC revised to $L1R4 \le 16$ and retained at $L1R4 \le 20$ for MI

2) Minimum subject grade requirements will remain

Admissions Criteria to Polytechnic Year 1

- Require 5 subjects: ELR2B2 ≤ 22, English Language, 2 relevant subjects, and 1 best subject compute at G3 level, 1 best subject compute at G2 level (4G3 & 1G2)
- Students who offer both 'best' subjects at G3 level will have their 'best" subject with a lower grade mapped from G3 to G2 based on an empirically validated grade mapping table (see below)

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How is it computed?

ELR2B2 computation depends on the type of course.

Example:

Student is interested in <u>Business, Engineering, Science, Facility Management, IT,</u> <u>Architecture, Design</u>

- Needs 2 relevant subjects Math, Science;
- His 2 best subjects Chinese, Hum (SS/ Geog)

Admissions Criteria to Poly Foundation Programme (PFP) - 4 years programme

Require 5 subjects: ELMAB3 <= 12, English Language [EL], Math [MA], three best [B] subjects, compute at G2 level.

Note:

- Admissions will be on a cluster-based approach ٠
- Students will enter one of three key broad clusters before being posted to a specific diploma course based ٠ on their interest and PFP performance:
 - Sciences
 - Design, Engineering & Technology
 Humanities, Art, Media and Business
- Students seeking admission to Nursing and Early Childhood Development & Education courses will ٠ continue to be admitted to these specific diplomas in their PFP.

ITE 3-Year Higher Nitec Course

Requirement: 4 subjects at G1 level

- ITE is transitioning NITEC courses to the enhanced 3-year Higher NITEC certification
 - In Year 1, students will undertake broad-based foundation courses exposing them to fundamental skills needed for the relevant industry sector
 - In Years 2 and 3, they will take more specialised modules, leading to a Higher NITEC certification
 - Students are also exposed to two linked industry attachments (IA): a threemonth IA in Year 2 and a six-month IA in Year 3, with the latter building on the learning outcomes and workplace competencies of the former



Admission Criteria to Direct Year 2 of Higher NITEC courses

Require 5 subjects: ELMAB3 <= 19*, English Language [EL], Math [MA], three best [B] subjects, compute at G2 level.

For those taking a combination of G3 and G2 subjects, G3 subjects will be mapped to G2 for the computation of the aggregate score.

Guarantee Poly Admission for ITE 3-Year Higher Nitec Course

From the AY2027 poly intake, poly admission will be guaranteed to **all Higher NITEC students with a minimum raw GPA of 3.5.**

- 1. Top 10% (~1,000) of Higher NITEC graduates across all courses will be guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma mapped to their ITE course.
- 2. Those who wish to progress to an unmapped course can seek admission through the Early Admissions Exercise.

ITE Progression Award (IPA)

- supports ITE graduates to upskill to a diploma earlier in their careers, to secure more progression prospects in their chosen professions.
- helps with the financial costs of obtaining a diploma and boosts ITE graduates' savings for longer-term goals, such as home ownership or retirement.

Option for 5th year in Secondary School

 Under Full SBB, eligible students will continue to have the option of a 5th year to pace their learning and offer subjects at a more demanding level to access more post-secondary pathways, after they sit for the SEC examinations at the

end of Secondary 4. Criteria to access 5th Year • If 3 or more G3 passes, must not qualify for JC/ MI/ Poly Year 1; • If 2 or fewer G3 passes, must attain ELMAB3 ≤ 21, or ELMAB3 ≤ 14 or MAB3 \leq 14 (at least Grade 5 for G2 subjects used in computation of aggregates) Subject level for subjects Student profile taken in 5th year Can update all subjects to G3 if Sec 4 students offering mostly G2 subjects, ELMAB3 \leq 19 progressing to 5th year to offer mostly G3 subjects. - Trust their abilities to grow to become better versions of themselves, while being careful not to project your expectations on them.
- Encourage them to take ownership of their goals and plans.
